BOOKS AND READINGS - ANGLESEA - A History, Volume 2 is now available for \$15. Written by Keith Cecil it adds to the continuing series "ALONG THE GREAT OCEAN ROAD" An interesting little publication recently acquired for the library tells the story of a trip made by the Roadknight family from their station property near Gerangamete to their Glenaire Station west of Cape Otway in 1863. As mentioned earlier "Early Anglesea Families" is now available for \$10. To whet your appetite printed below is a paragraph on the Appleton family.

APPLETON George Buniley - Colonel. 17 South Road Brighton Beach. Died 1945 APPLETON Annie (Brearley) w.o. G.B.A. Children - Daughters Tettie and Lily (Mrs Riggall)

Geo Appleton ran the Wool Broking and Stock Agency business Appleton & Appleton for 5 years from 1887 in Moorabool Street Geelong with his brother W T Appleton. He began his military career in the Geelong Artillery. In 1914 Col. G B Appleton left Australia in charge of 1500 men for Egypt. He was diverted to the staff of the High Commissioner, London, on the way across. His overseas wartime mission was then to visit the Australian wounded. He married Annie Brearley, daughter of Sharpe Brearley (Geelong Tanner). Later a property agent G B Appleton & Co at 131 William Street Melbourne. Staunch supporter of Anglesea Recreation & Sports Club from its inception. He rowed in the first Regatta in 1911, and in 1919 at the age of 69 rowed in a four-oar crew. President of the Anglesea Recreation & Sports Club 1937/8/9. The 1937 trophies were presented by Mrs G B Appleton, wife of the President. Colonel G B Appleton recommends "Sunnymead Estate" (Sunnymead brochure). G B Appleton and W T Appleton are both on the Anglesea 1914/1918 honour roll. Tettie Apppeton acquired the former Anna Mackay Presbyterian Church site No 1 (4 acres) and sold this to Beaumont Investments c/o T M Burke in 1947, who then subdivided it into 20 homesites. At that time Tettie Appleton was living at 3 Mayfield Ave Malvern. Lots 33/34 & 38/39 Murray Estate were originally purchased to give a clear view from their house down to the river. The blocks were sold by the estate of Tettie Appleton to J M Bradshaw in 1957.

APPLETON William Thomas - Born Leeds 1959 - Died 16/2/1930 - aged 71 APPLETON Elizabeth Jane (Traill) w.o. W T A - sister of Annie T McMillan Children - 2 sons, 2 daughters

William T Appleton was one time Geelong manager for Huddart, Parker & Co. By 1929 he was Chairman and Managing Director of that company. He married Miss Elizabeth Jane Traill daughter of John Traill of Melbourne. His son W T Appleton died in World War 1 (Anglesea WW1 Honour Roll). W T Appleton Jnr rowed in the 1910 Blink Bonnie crew. In 1918 ownership of William Parker's "Marguerite House", lots 41 & 42 Parker Street changed to Elizabeth Appleton. Unfortunately that year's bushfire destroyed the house and it was not rebuilt. In 1952 these two lots were purchased for £700 by Hubert Bowman, a Geelong Solicitor, and later resubdivided into 8 sites.
